This week we learned more ways to express how we feel. When an adjective ends in the vowel “o” or “a” (as in *cansado* or *cansada*), the “o” is considered masculine and the “a” is feminine. Boys are *cansado* and girls are *cansada*. *Estoy* means “I am” and *tengo* means “I have”.

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| 1. Estoy feliz. | (eh-STOY feh-LEES) | I am happy. |
| 2. Estoy triste. | (eh-STOY TREE-steh) | I am sad. |
| 3. Estoy enojado/enojada. | (eh-STOY eh-no-HA-tho) | I am mad. |
| 4. Estoy enfermo/enferma. | (eh-STOY en-FAIR-mo) | I am sick. |
| 5. Estoy nervioso/nerviosa. | (eh-STOY nair-vee-OH-so) | I am nervous. |
| 6. Estoy cansado/cansada | (eh-STOY kahn-SAH-tho) | I am tired. |
| 7. Tengo hambre. | (TAIN-go AHM-breh) | I am hungry. |
| 8. Tengo sed. | (TAIN-go SETH) | I am thirsty. |
| 9. Tengo frío. | (TAIN-go FREE-oh) | I am cold. |
| 10. Tengo calor. | (TAIN-go cah-LOR) | I am hot. |
